

HIV/AIDS Global situation: 2005

- **There are 40.3 million people living with HIV/AIDS**
- **AIDS has killed more than 25 million people since it was first recognized in 1981**
- **4.9 million people became infected in 2005, according to a U.N update.**
- **In 2005 the condition killed 3.1 million, including nearly 600,000 children**
- **Sub-Saharan Africa is still the worst affected, with 26 million sufferers**
- **In Asia 8.2 million peoples living with HIV/AIDS**
- **The highest HIV rates are in Swaziland (39 per cent), Botswana (37 per cent) and Lesotho (29 per cent)**

Figures released by the United States' Centers for Disease Control (CDC) suggest that the incidence of new HIV infections in America fell between 2001 and 2004. A total of 1,57,252 people were newly diagnosed with HIV in this period in the 33 US states that use confidential, name-based surveillance of HIV infections.
